# The Cleveland Orchestra to perform free community concert at Wade Oval Wednesday as part of lineup of summer community programs and events

CLEVELAND — The Cleveland Orchestra will be out at festivals and events all summer long, building stronger connections with our communities and ensuring classical music remains a vibrant part of life in Cleveland.

Earlier this month, the Orchestra kicked off its <u>summer community engagement programming</u> by participating in Pride in the CLE on June 1 and Parade the Circle on June 8.

The programming continues with a free, outdoor Cleveland Orchestra performance at Wade Oval Wednesday on June 26 at 7 p.m. as part of University Circle's summer concert series. The program, led by former Cleveland Orchestra Associate Conductor Vinay Parameswaran and emceed by Chris Webb, features Berstein's Overture to Candide, Valerie Coleman's Seven O'Clock Shout, Smetana's The Moldau from Má vlast, Still's Summerland, and Rimsky-Korsakov's Capriccio espagnol.

In case of adverse weather, the performance will move indoors to Severance Music Center.

"The Cleveland Orchestra carries the Cleveland name all over the world, proudly representing the community we call home. This summer and throughout the year we look forward to opportunities to connect, engage, collaborate, and unite with our community through the universal language of music," said Joan Katz Napoli, the Orchestra's Vice President of Education and Community.

Later in the summer, The Cleveland Orchestra will also be present at One World Day on August 25, the Waterloo Arts Festival on September 14, and ¡Celebrando! on September 21.

Additional community engagement activities will take place at Blossom Music Center on July 13 with the Hispanic Family Community Night and at Severance Music Center on September 14 with the Hispanic Heritage Month Concert.
